SWAP: Sheldon-Williams Advisory Program

We also encourage regular contact between parents/guardians and the SWAP teacher. This allows both the student and the parents/guardians to build a relationship with their advisory teacher.

Edsby - Parent Portal

Edsby is a convenient and efficient internet-based way for parents/guardians to monitor their student's progress on a daily or weekly bases. All parents/guardians can have access to their child(ren)'s attendance and marks by setting up a Parent Portal account.
